Candidate Event Week Approves Six New Missionaries for The Mission Society

(Norcross/Atlanta, GA – October 7, 2008) – Six new missionaries were approved for service with The Mission

Society at the conclusion of the Missionary Candidate Event (MCE) on October 4th, 2008. The week consisted of time for the candidates to get to know the staff and other missionaries, participate in a variety of ministries around the Atlanta area, meet with The Mission Society's staff counselor, and interviews were held with each candidate to access their readiness for cross-cultural ministry.

This group of cross-cultural workers will join other teams of Mission Society missionaries in various locations around the globe. All of the newly approved missionaries will participate in two weeks of Orientation Training in Teresopolis – Rio de Janeiro, Brazil in July 2009. After raising their own financial support, the missionaries will then attend language school for a period of time before departing for their field of service.

Jennifer, a current resident of Hazel Green, Alabama, earned an associate's degree in accounting and a bachelor's degree in business. She worked in the corporate world for several years before going into missions. For the past two years, Jennifer has been involved in short-term mission trips in various locations around the globe. She will serve with The Mission Society team in South America.

Originally from Texas and North Carolina, Elliott and Katherine have made a home in Peachtree City, Georgia. Elliott attended Davidson College and earned a degree in economics before pursuing a MBA from the University of North Carolina. Katherine attended Queens College and worked as a preschool teacher for several years before staying home full-time with their children. Elliott and Katherine have three children - Emily, Ryan, and Cason. The Stotlers joined The Mission Society for a career term and are exploring serving in Africa.

Faith Thomson
