Interactive workshop: Making a difference in and around our community

SANDUSKY, Mich.—Members of Countryside Free Methodist Church will gain a greater understanding of local, national, and international outreach this winter when The Mission Society, which sends Christian missionaries worldwide on ministry assignments, presents a Global Outreach Weekend to the congregation, Feb. 25-26.

"God has chosen the local church as his instrument to spread the gospel to the ends of the earth. "Jesus' parting words to his disciples were that they witness for Him throughout the world," said Roger Wright, Midwest regional director for church ministry of The Mission Society. "The challenge is encouraging Christians to leave the four walls of the church to reach their neighborhoods and world with God's love and hope. The Global Outreach Weekend, which begins at 8:30 a.m. Feb. 25, is designed to help Christians understand the biblical basis of worldwide missions and challenge them to become personally involved in outreach. This missions workshop will train and empower the mission leaders in the nuts and bolts of mobilizing their congregations to reach their friends, local community, and even impact communities in other countries. Going forward, as the principles taught during the weekend are implemented they will become more effective and strategic in missions.

This weekend includes a six-hour seminar, as well as ministry to the entire congregation in Sunday worship and Sunday School.
