The Mission Society Sending Youngstown Woman to Haiti

NORCROSS, Ga. – The Mission Society, which sends Christian missionaries worldwide on ministry assignments, has consecrated Natalie Brown of Youngstown, Ohio, as a missionary to Haiti.

The Most Reverend Dr. Robert Kwasi Aboagye-Mensah, past presiding bishop of The Methodist Church – Ghana and a member of The Mission Society's board of directors, spoke during the Nov. 1 service where Brown was consecrated.

Brown is majoring in religion at Liberty University, Lynchburg, Va., and has been active in her community, working within her church and building relationships with the homeless population.

“Natalie will be offering care and compassion to the people of Haiti who need to know about the deep, abiding love Christ holds for them,” said Dick McClain, president and CEO of The Mission Society. “We are blessed to consecrate her as a missionary.”

Founded in 1984 in the Wesleyan tradition, The Mission Society recruits, trains and sends Christian missionaries to minister around the world. At present, it has more than 200 missionaries in 38 countries.
