Founded in 1984, The Mission Society recruits, trains and sends missionaries around the world to communicate the gospel through word and deed. The organization is involved in agricultural training, evangelism, church planting, literacy, medical work, arts ministries and numerous other pursuits. It supports nearly 200 missionaries in 35 countries.

Pickett and his team coordinate funding support for The Mission Society's ministries for missionaries, field projects, local church outreach and training for international leaders. The advancement department also provides opportunities for partners to participate in Jesus' mission through their gifts and prayers for The Mission Society's ministries.



Pickett has served as senior pastor of St. James United Methodist Church in Tampa, Fla., and Trinity United Methodist Church in Palm Beach Gardens, Fla. Prior to his tenure as senior pastor, he served as associate pastor of Lake Magdalene United Methodist Church in Tampa. He is a gifted speaker, specializing in men's and couples' retreats and revivals. Pickett also has a strong background in sales management and communications.

He has a Master of Divinity from the Candler School of Theology at Emory University in Atlanta; a Bachelor of Arts Degree in Organizational Communications from the University of Central Florida in Orlando, Fla.; and a Associate of Arts Degree from Seminole State College in Lake Mary, Fla.

Pickett and his wife diane have two grown children, Mackenzie Claire and Andrew Clark.

Prior to his coming to The Mission Society in 2003, outgoing Vice President Dennis E. Brown served as chairman, president and CEO, vice president, executive director and board member for major for-profit and non-profit organizations and corporations. Positions he held include: co-founder and executive director of JobSeekers USA, chairman of the board of American Health Companies, president and CEO of Diet Centers, Inc., owner of a customer-service consulting business in Atlanta and national sales manager for the Avon Company.

Brown has a Bachelor of Science in psychology and a Master's Degree in personal and guidance counseling from Truman University. He also served as a business development specialist and coach to CEOs.

"The Mission Society is indebted to Dennis," says President Wilkins. "Because of his passion for connecting people to God's mission, this organization has advanced far beyond where it was when he came to us. It is untelling how many more are involved in missions today because of Dennis Brown. We will miss him."
