Bible study in the local women's prison, and host a feeding program.

When COVID-19 caused the Peruvian government to enforce a lockdown, many residents were left without the resources to buy food. Tim and Jennifer worried about the children who attend their family's ministry.

These children, some of whom are orphans left to fend for themselves, do not have enough to eat even under normal circumstances.

Tim met with the local police and explained the plight of his neighbors. The police gave Tim special permission to take food to the children and families he serves. Soon, Tim and Jennifer were delivering groceries to more than 300 people each week.

"One mother called me and said her children had not eaten in four days," said Tim. "I took her some food, and she was amazed that a stranger would help. I told her Jesus is no stranger and that He cares for her."

An enduring legacy

The TMS Global community mourns the passing of Alice Maclin, the wife and ministry partner of our organization's founding president, H.T. Maclin, on June 23, 2020.

Wed in 1947, H.T. and Alice began serving as cross-cultural workers in the Central Congo in 1952. In 1960, the couple and their four children moved to Kenya where H.T. and Alice founded an institution for the training of Christian broadcasters/scriptwriters and audio-visual specialists.

The Maclins returned to the United States in 1971. H.T. worked for The United Methodist Church's mission board, and Alice taught at what is now Georgia Perimeter College. In early 1984, H.T. became the founding president of the newly launched organization, The Mission Society for United Methodists, which is now TMS Global.

Finding worth



Two Thai youth now know they matter because of the witness of a worker you helped send through your support.

Thomas* is a TMS Global cross-cultural worker who serves in Thailand. Thomas teaches English and shares his faith in Jesus with his neighbors and students.

Thomas began tutoring Niran* after school. When they first met, Niran wasn't doing well in school, was misbehaving in class, and had a bad reputation in the neighborhood.

Thomas offered to tutor Niran and his younger cousin, Kla,* for free. They began to meet each week and, as they studied, people from the neighborhood would come by and interrupt the lessons with hurtful comments made to the boys.

"I prayed and showed up every week with patience and a positive attitude, determined to love these kids," said Thomas. "I told them I didn't care how long it took; I would teach them every week."

Slowly, Thomas could see a change in Niran and Kla. They fought less and tried harder to learn English. The boys began to grow in confidence. The boys' family noticed the difference in their behavior.

"People in the neighborhood now smile and show kindness to Niran and Kla," said Thomas. "Life has dealt them a very difficult hand, but instead of dipping their heads in shame, they smile. They know they matter."

It is your support that enables Thomas to serve in Thailand, offering the love and message of Jesus to vulnerable youth who are not yet aware of His grace. Thank you for giving so others will know their worth in Him.
