# A vision for the future

José was eight years old when he lost his eye in an accident.

"For families like José's, who struggle to make ends meet, medical care can often be out of reach."

In the rural village in Nicaragua where he lives, medical clinics are few and far between. And for families like José's, who struggle to make ends meet, medical care can often be out of reach financially as well.

#### **Undue hardship in Nicaragua**

When the accident happened, José's grandfather took him to the closest clinic, several miles away. But José had to be transferred to three other clinics before arriving at a medical facility with the capability of removing his eye. It was a week later

before the two returned home.

"My father had to sell four cows to pay for the medicine, surgery, and expenses from the trip," remembers José. "When I got home, everyone was very sad. My mother cried all of the time. I could not see very well with only one eye, so I stayed inside and did not go out to play with my friends. Some kids called me 'one-eyed,' so I tied a rag around my head to cover my missing eye."



#### A divine encounter

Around this time, José's grandfather met TMS Global cross-cultural workers, Ronnie and Angi Hopkins, who serve in Nicaragua. He asked the Hopkinses how to go about getting a glass eye for José. To his surprise, the Hopkinses offered to raise the funds through their ministry. Soon after, José traveled to a hospital in the capital for the procedure.

# "The classes have helped me to grow spiritually," said José.

"Ronnie, Angi, and those who support their ministry provided absolutely everything for me!" said José.

José's confidence increased after he received his eye prosthesis. He attended elementary school and was at the top of his class. He no longer felt as if he needed to hide indoors.

"Receiving the glass eye changed my life!" he said.

#### A bright future for José

José is now 17 years old. He attends high school in another village. He leaves for school at four o'clock in the morning, travels by horseback to the river, takes a boat, and then walks for two-and-a-half hours. After his classes, José travels back home.

José plans to attend college and wants to study English and business administration. But until then, he is one of the students in Ronnie and Angi's youth leadership program.

# YOU are helping raise up leaders in Nicaragua

The Hopkinses designed a one-year course for students who want to learn more about leadership. The students, ages 16-26, engage in a variety of activities including doing public speaking, creating a resumé, having a daily devotional time, setting short-term and long-term goals, and volunteering for community service.

"The classes have helped me to grow spiritually," said José.

# Partnering with local communities—through YOUR support

In addition to the youth leadership program, the Hopkinses, through donations by their supporters, started a medical clinic in José's village. They have also worked with nearby communities to build schools and provide access to clean water.

"We meet with the community leaders and find out what they need," said Ronnie. "Then the residents provide the labor, and our supporters provide the funds."

"When I think about all that has happened in my community and to me, I am very grateful to God and to our North American friends for so much help," says José. "God is good!"

So when Paul and Kelly Wiegert began ministering in Peru, they prayed about how they could help.


That's when they met Hilda.

#### A heart for ministry

"Hilda has a heart for the church and for the women in our community," said Kelly. "She is an excellent seamstress and wanted to make and sell cloth diapers." So Hilda and the Wiegerts partnered together to form Ella Handiworks.

#### Sowing seeds of faith

Hilda started with two apprentices: Raquel and Alicia. As they learned to sew, the women also started meeting for a weekly Bible study to learn more about God's Word and how to apply it to their daily lives.

Thanks to donations from ministry friends like you, the women were able to purchase two industrial sewing machines, and Ella Handiworks began production.

After their first week, Hilda, Raquel, and Alicia each received a paycheck. Raquel's son was so excited because his mother bought him some fruit, which she had never had the money to buy before. He also prayed and thanked God for Paul, Kelly, and Hilda and the opportunity they gave his mother to work.

"We want these women to know their worth," said Kelly. "Their worth is in God, and He wants us to share His love through actions and in love."

### It's all about the mission

When I was a young boy, I remember learning in Sunday school . . .

> This is the church. This is the steeple. Open the doors and see all the people.

Well, I always messed it up. I'd put my hands in the wrong place. I'd say, This is the church. This is the steeple. Open the doors . . . and the people are supposed to be inside, right? But when I'd open the doors they'd be standing on the roof. I could never get it right.
